

- Increased screening/testing of non-paint sources of Lead

- Transitioned to new clinic site for SFT in Bridgeton
- Monthly SFT clinics at both Bridgeton and Millville sites
- Educated parents regarding the importance of keeping their children's immunizations up to date
- Worked with schools in the community to provide immunization and completed immunization audits for compliance

- Successfully completed all communicable disease investigations including COVID-19 and Monkeypox






